Koinonia (pronounced "koy – know – <u>knée</u> – ah") is a very important word in the original Greek of the New Testament. It is a rich conceptual word with many layers of meaning including association, communion, fellowship, brotherhood/sisterhood, participation, and communal sharing. Here at Saint Mary's,

we are using KOINONIA to name our summertime weekday gatherings for prayer and fellowship. Every other Wednesday evening in July and August (see the schedule below) at 6:30 pm, we will gather together for an informal, outdoor time of prayer, sharing, learning, food and fellowship. As you will see, we will be exploring some different ways to pray, sing and make music. There will be time for you yourself to explore by moving your body, playing a drum, singing a song, and strumming a ukulele. And then, of course, we will share some food together! This is a great opportunity for you to bring your summer guests or neighbors and introduce them to our Saint Mary's community. And it is the hope of your parish leadership that these outdoor gatherings will give us all a chance to re-connect with one another in the midst of our various summertime adventures. I hope to see you all and to share koinonia with you throughout the summer!



Vestry Highlights from the May Vestry Meeting

Your vestry held their June meeting on Wednesday, the 17th. Good fellowship and a cooperative spirit were present as they have been all year.

All is going well. Participation in our services, our various committees, guilds, activities and programs is strong as are our finances ... thank you.

Vestry discussion highlights included:

- * 125th Anniversary Celebration ... wow ... what an action-filled several weeks ... thank you everyone.
- * Rectory second-story windows ... Following recommendations to meet fire codes, we are moving forward to replace 8 second-story bedroom windows with 4 modern double width windows that will preserve the character of the building.
- * Finances ... Our financial situation is currently strong, and it will be important for pledges to continue to come in over the summer ... thank you in advance. We will review our 6-month finances at our August meeting and adjust as necessary.
- * Lower level repairs ... The replacement of the flooring in the lower level of the parish house is complete, and we await the results of our air quality testing in preparation for a grand re-opening.
- * Oil vs. Gas ... We continue to explore the pros and cons of converting some or all of our facilities

from our aging oil furnaces to natural gas. More on this over the summer as information and figures come in.

* Vestry openings for 2016 ... we have commissioned the vestry nominating committee to bring forward recommendations for the four 3-year vestry seats beginning in January 2016 and del-

egates to the 2016 Diocesan Convention ... more information will be forthcoming.

Father Nathan led us in our continued discussion of the rich history of the Episcopal Church and our year-long discussion of "Renewing The Episcopal Identity." Themes will include: "change," "relevance," "growth" and "Living as Disciples." More on this exploration in future AVEs.

Please read through our July AVE for the specifics on our many activities and initiatives that are made possible by the dedicated work of so many ... truly "many hands make for lighter work."

We, Jim & Janet, want to thank all of the vestry and our parish family for your continued support and to thank Father Nathan for his inspiration and leadership. We look forward to summer and all of our planned and unplanned Fall activities. The first half of 2015 closed with the joyful celebration of our 125th anniversary reinforcing our Mission to CELEBRATE, HONOR and SERVE. We are humbled to be your wardens and appreciate the trust you have granted us!


Saint Mary's 125th Anniversary Celebration



Churchyard Burial Lots

The Churchyard Committee encourages you to take a walk about the property, experience the beauty of our Churchyard, and consider your plans for a final resting place. There are lots available in two areas of our beloved Churchyard - the Burial Garden and Saint Mary's Woods. Lots in southern Maine are increasingly hard to find and costs reflect the market.



Churchyard Areas:

<u>Churchyard</u> refers to the original Churchyard. It's located directly behind the rectory and contains 192 4' x 11' burial plots. All the plots in the Churchyard section are already in perpetual use.

<u>Saint Mary's Woods</u> is the area formerly known as the Columbarium. It was designed for the interment of ashes. Saint Mary's Woods is located at the southern end of the Churchyard and is 75' x 100'. It borders on Pine Grove Cemetery. Pine Grove Cemetery is a separate, non-related entity. Saint Mary's Woods will always remain natural. Lots are available to parishioners for perpetual use.

<u>The Burial Garden</u> refers to the newest area. It was approved by the Vestry in 1987 and is located to the right of the Rectory. The Burial Garden also borders on Pine Grove Cemetery. The Burial Garden includes a beautiful allée of pear trees that forms a spectacular canopy of blossoms in the spring and colorful foliage in the fall. Burial Garden lots may be used for interment of ashes or burials in a full plot. The Burial Garden includes 198 lots. Many of the lots remain available to parishioners for perpetual use.



Adopt a Bed

Interested in "adopting" a bed on our beautiful campus? Pick any area and think of it as your own! Check out the bulletin board near the elevator in the Parish House for available beds. The area may be small or large, prominent or tucked away. Your commitment would simply be to keep an eye on it and weed it, as needed. Note that this work does not include the formal beds behind the chapel that are beautifully maintained by members of St. Mary's Garden Club. Contact Lucy Ellis, Landscape Team 450-3650 C.


