From the Rector: ONE FINAL ACT OF BLESSING

It is summer on the coast of Maine and life is good! What a perfect time to reflect on how we will eventually conclude our lives on this earth. In particular, I am thinking of what happens to our bodies once they cease to function. Do you know that both a conventional burial and cremation are processes which are quite harmful to the earth itself and to our neighbors? At least for me, it does not seem consistent to conclude my life in which I have labored assiduously to bring God's healing, hope and new life to the earth by committing one final act of harm, pollution and destruction. A conventional burial (which includes embalming, a vault, and a casket) introduces toxic chemicals into the ground and destroys important natural resources by burying them forever. In America, it has been estimated that we could build a new Golden Gate Bridge every single year with the amount of wood, concrete and steel which we bury in cemeteries annually.



Cremation has become a far more common approach in our area. It offers reduced costs, flexibility in timing and in the final resting place of the body. However, cremation is also detrimental to the earth and to our neighbors. An enormous amount of fossil fuels are used to reach a temperature of between 1400 to 1800 degrees Fahrenheit which is required for proper incineration. In addition, toxic gases are released through the burning of dental fillings and other assorted objects in the body. The cremation process is a contributor to greenhouse gases and pollution in the air.

But there are other options! Here is my question: why not simply return our bodies to the earth from which they came and allow the natural processes of decomposition to turn them into healthy and fertile soil which gives rise to new life? Is not this what we imply when we confess that "we are mortal, formed of the earth, and to

what we imply when we confess that "we are mortal, formed of the earth, and to earth shall we return" (BCP, p.499)? Is it not right and good that our final act be one of blessing the earth and our neighbors by promoting new life rather than an act of harm and toxic pollution? What is more, by state law, once a plot of land is used for burial it must remain dedicated to that purpose and cannot be used for any other. Therefore, natural burials can also become a means by which to preserve land in its natural state. This is called Conservation Burial, and I believe that the people of the Portland area need to have access to natural burials in a natural setting.

I am convinced that this is something that our Lord is asking us to consider. So please take time to reflect on whether your final act on earth will be one that blesses and heals or one that harms and pollutes. Do not leave this for others to decide. Let it be your decision made with clarity and intention. Also, be in touch with me if you share my interest in this idea of Conservation Burial and in creating this option for the people of our area. If we can find enough people of like mind, then we can make this happen and we can do something good for the earth and our neighbors for generations to come. May it be so!



gress is more important than perfection. Stan, Paul and Rod were the fish spotters, fly tier on'ers, and netted the fish for them.



A faithful team from Saint Mary's continues their work as the sponsors of a unit at the Long Creek Youth Correctional Center in South Portland. We have sponsored this unit for several years, and we make regular visits.

This summer, as in past summers, we have been putting on barbecues for the residents on Maple Unit. Thanks to the hard work of our chef, Jim Stoddard, and a team that includes Betsy Stoddard, Rayle Ainsworth, Becky Pride, David Robinson, John Henson, and Marian McCue we are able to provide hot dogs, hamburgers and treats to the 15 or so residents on the unit.

These kids, some as young as 11 years of age, appreciate that a group of people come in and enjoy spending time with them. Maple Unit is the place where youths are first placed when they

come into contact with the criminal justice system, or are awaiting placement into a group home or other residential setting. Many of the kids turn up there because of bad family situations and a lack of mental health treatment options for young people.

We would be pleased to have more people join our group, which does require a criminal background check and volunteer orientation.

Sunday, August 13 - Feast of Saint Mary the Virgin




The Feast Day of Saint Mary, our Patron, is on August 15 each year, and we celebrate the Feast of the Sunday closest to this date. We know that God had a plan, has a plan for us all. And perhaps the shape of our Gospel would be different, were it not for our Saint Mary, Jesus' mother.

Sunday, August 13, 6 PM London Organist Recital at Saint Mary's:

Concert organist, Alan Saggerson, music director at St. Mary with All Souls, London (West Hamstead in London), will offer a free recital here at Saint Mary's. Mr. Saggerson has a degree from Hertford College, Oxford, is a trustee of the *Royal College of Organists St. Giles Academy organ project* which oversees the rebuilding of historic organs. He has toured annually in the Netherlands, France, the UK and this year, the United Sates. In 2014 he was featured as a recitalist for the *Royal College of Organist's* 150th anniversary celebration. As part of our Celebration Weekend, Mr. Saggerson has chosen music specifically for the unique qualities of our Opus 3384 Casavant organ. The organ was designed by Gerhard Brunzema and is reminiscent of north German Baroque instruments. Mr. Saggerson will play three movements from François Couperin's *Messe des Couvents*, a prelude by Nicolaus Bruhns, the chorale prelude "St. Mary" by Sir Hubert H. Parry, the fugue of the Magnificat by J.S. Bach, and "March" by Nicholas Choveaux (French Canadian composer who lived and worked in the UK). Come one and all. Free and open to everyone!




