rom the Rector: "Present Yourselves as a Living Sacrifice" (Romans 12:1)

We need to talk about money. After all, our Teacher Jesus spoke about this as much as anything else. And why is that? Because our use of money is a reliable indicator of what we value and prioritize. If we honestly intend to love God with our whole selves, how is this demonstrated in the way we use our money? At Saint Mary's, our annual Stewardship Campaign is one avenue for all of us to put our money where our mouth is. If we truly love God and the saving mission of God, then we will pledge our support to the local church.

It is Stewardship season once again. Find a few hours to make a draft budget for your household in 2018. Then



pray and ask the Holy Spirit to help you demonstrate your love for God in that budget. If 2% of your income in 2017 was given to support the mission of God, then make a commitment to increase that to 3% in 2018. Figure out how much you gave (or will give) in this year and make a specific plan to increase it in some way next year. The goal for all of us is to pledge the tithe. That means to give 10% of our income back to God in support of God's mission among humanity. And yes, this is in fact achievable for each household, because it depends entirely upon the choices we make.

It is no accident that we focus on Stewardship in the month of November. The basis of all this is gratitude. The money at our disposal is a gift given to us by God so that with it we can participate in God's work of blessing the world. Money is NOT entrusted to you for your comfort, for your pleasure, for your desires. It is given to you for GOD's desires, so that you can show the world what it is that God treasures and cherishes. So in this fast-approaching holiday season, let us present ourselves as a

living sacrifice to God by pledging a portion of our income to this local church known as Saint Mary's. And together let us show the world that we truly love God and the saving, healing, reconciling mission of God as seen in Jesus Christ our Lord.

Vestry Highlights from your Wardens

The Vestry met on October 18, and our October meeting was focused on the financial workings of Saint Mary's. The Budget and Finance Committee presented a draft 2018 budget. After extensive work, the budget presented has a deficit of over \$20,000. In the next few weeks, the Vestry will share their input with the Executive Committee, and we'll reexamine our priorities to reach a final budget.

We also discussed our Stewardship Campaign for 2018, God's Work, Our Hands. Our goal is \$285,000, and it's imperative we meet that goal to enable us to support our goals to continue growing our engagement with children and youth, increasing our intentional opportunities for deeper connections with God and each other, offering compassionate care for those struggling, and welcoming those seeking God. The Vestry received their pledge packets at the meeting. Parishioners will receive their packets by the time the AVE is published. Vestry members asked that we provide more information for parishioners, which you will find on pg. 8 of this AVE, on the budget and the importance of pledging to our overall financial health.

We discussed the plans for our summer fundraiser. Betsy and Jim Stoddard are stepping down from chairing the event after many years. We are indebted to them for their steadfast work on this event for so many years. Jack and Susan Thomas and Missy and Chris Smithwick are hanging up their aprons too. Jack



and Susan and Missy and Chris have generously donated the food for our event and served as the chefs! We are so grateful for their service. Replacing them will be hard! We talked about finding other lobster providers or changing up the event, perhaps to a Farm - to-Table event. Anyone interested in helping with this event should let Father Nathan or the Wardens know of their interest!

The Nominating Committee chaired by Nadine Timberlake reported that they have received 16 nominations for Vestry and Convention delegates. The Nominating Team is working through the nominations, speaking with people to determine their interest. Thank you to all who nominated and to those considering the possibility of serving Saint Mary's in this way.

God's Work, Our Hands (Proverbs 3:27)

"Saint Mary's has so many programs, so much going on!"

This comment has been made by many parishioners over the years. While it may be true about other churches as well as Saint Mary's has a long history of having lots of programs and activities. In the early days of our parish, after the Brown family gave the church and the buildings to the Diocese, we have been an action hub. Over the years, the Parish House has hosted a pediatric clinic, preschool, and served as a Red Cross station during World War II. Parishioners actually rolled bandages and collected other supplies to support the war effort. Saint Mary's has hosted lectures, concerts, and other community programs. Today, we host AA and Al-Anon meetings, Bible study groups and our twice-monthly Souper Supper free community dinners. Our spaces welcome musicians of all ages for rehearsals and concerts, noonday prayer three days a week and a Eucharist on Thursdays. Our buildings welcome many and provide comfort to all who need it. Our recent renovations ensure parishioners and guests are warm and comfortable. Our staff juggles the schedule and welcomes the community. Our annual pledge campaign supports the costs associated with heating, lighting, cleaning, maintaining and insuring our buildings to ensure they continue to serve the community and our parish.

Our 2018 Stewardship Campaign is under way. The pledge packets are in the mail. Our goal this year is \$285,000. It's a big number, but together we can reach it. Thank you for pledging to support our ability to use our hands to do God's work.

Advent begins on November 26, and so begins our season of joy and the Sparkles Season. But Sparkles is a community, and we need help from all of you . . .

VOLUNTEERING – A variety of opportunities, some for an hour and some for much more, some ahead of the actual fair, some on the day of Sparkles, and some after. We need MANY bakers for both baked goods and cookies. We need help with decorating, setting up and tearing down the displays, greeting shoppers, cashiering, serving in the café, bagging purchases and MORE! Many hands make light work, and we welcome everyone. We promise that it will be fun, festive, and rewarding – plus it is a great way to meet new people.

FLYERS – Each year, we print flyers that need to be placed around Falmouth, Cumberland, Yarmouth, Portland, and other close environs to remind the general public about our Sparkles activities. Please take 3 or 4 of them, and hang them at places you frequent or work.

We will celebrate the Feast of All Saints on Sunday, November 5. This will be an all family Sunday in which the children from Guiding RAY will participate in the whole service. - ♥Providing Coffee Hour on Sundays



The Pihcintu Chorus Performance a Smashing Success



St Mary Schola "Sparkles" Concert

On Sunday, December 10th at 4:00 PM at the Episcopal Church of Saint Mary, the St Mary Schola is presenting a concert entitled *Christmas Pastorale* preceded at 3:30PM by a pre-concert lecture. As always, there will be a gala reception in the Parish Hall with food and wine for concertgoers and musicians following the performance. This has become so popular that the concert sells out with some people having to be turned away for lack of space. If you want to secure a seat and come to the reception, I urge you to buy your tickets early either in the Parish Office, at Sunday coffee hour, or online at www.stmaryschola.org.

The concert schedule contains wonderful music from 15th century English carols, and from composers such as Josquin des Prez, Claudio Monteverdi, Heinrich Schütz, Michael Praetorius, Guillaume Dufay, and of course J. S. Bach. Interspersed will be readings from the bibles of King James and John Wycliffe and even a reading in Old English from the Exeter Book of the 8th-9th century. It will be a truly unique program and one that any fan of early music and English history will not want to miss.

Tickets for this Schola concert at Saint Mary's are \$30 per person this year (students are free). I realize this is an increase over previous ticket prices, but for the fine music with food and wine to follow it's still a bargain (and similar to other community holiday concerts or Saint Mary's fundraisers like the Lobster Bake & Auction.) Since this concert is a fundraiser for Saint Mary's, the Schola Board hopes we can generate even more income for Sparkles than the approximately \$2400 raised the past two years. The concert will also be presented on Friday, December 8th at 7:30PM at the Cathedral Church of St Luke in Portland and on Tuesday, December 12th at 7:30PM at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Portland, both of which remain at \$20 per person as no reception follows these two programs.
