From the Rector: 2018 Sabbatical Adventure



In keeping with a practice that is becoming increasingly common throughout The Episcopal Church, the policy of the Diocese of Maine is that all clergy in charge of congregations are allowed a sabbatical leave of 4 months after every 5 years in service. Since November 2017 marked 5 years since I began as Rector of Saint Mary's, plans have been prepared for me to take this leave in 2018. As I'm sure you can tell, the word *sabbatical* comes from sabbath which comes from the ancient Hebrew word for rest. A clergy sabbatical is intended to be a time for study and continuing education, rest and

refreshment, and also for travel to gain a new perspective. By God's grace, it looks like I will be able to cover all three of these aspects this year, but this sabbatical will occur in three blocks of time rather than in a continuous four months away.

Beginning March 12, the first block will be a month at Fort Jackson, South Carolina to attend the Basic Leadership Course for Professional Chaplains at the Naval Chaplaincy School and Center. One of the great benefits of serving as a Navy officer is the kind of regular leadership training that courses like this provide. I have also

heard that at Fort Jackson we will have our morning physical training guided by Marines. If you know me, then you will know how excited I am about this!

After a brief return in late April and early May, the second block of time away will be focused on time with family. Angus will graduate from West Point on May 26, although this will actually be one full week of events and festivities. A few weeks later in June, Angus will marry his fiancée whom he met at Falmouth High School. Needless to say, there will be a lot going on in our household! Between these events is the Trek Across Maine. We have registered a Godspeed team from Saint Mary's for this adventure, and there is certainly room for anyone else who may be interested!

Highlights from your Wardens

On Saturday, February 10th, the Vestry gathered in the Guild Room for the annual retreat. Father Nathan led a short Bible study on a text of Isaiah. We reviewed the Parochial Report for 2018. We approved the report as presented and will send it on to the Diocese. Sandy Couch Kelly was nominated to serve as Vestry Clerk and was elected unanimously. Thank you, Sandy!

We had a general discussion about revenue. Our revenue comes primarily from pledge income. We also receive revenue from fundraisers, investment income, rental income, and loose offerings. One suggestion was to create a printed brochure outlining our rental program for visitors. We also talked about advertising if a cost-efficient option is available.

Merle Marie Troeger, parishioner and member of the Bishop Discernment Committee, asked for our input on various components of bishop leadership. She also mentioned there's a link to a survey on the diocesan website until the end of February. All are welcome to take the survey and share their thoughts.

Father Nathan led us in a leadership and planning exercise he participated in during his January Naval training.

We discussed Father Nathan's sabbatical. Below, you will find biographical information on the Rev. Sara D'Angio White, or 'Pastor Sara' as she prefers to be called. Pastor Sara will join us on Palm Sunday for the first time. She'll be covering most Thursdays and Sundays while Father Nathan is away. She'll work with the Pastoral Partners to assist on pastoral issues as needed. Be sure to wear name tags so Pastor Sara can get to know our names.

Meet Pastor Sara D'Angio White

Sara D'Angio White is an Episcopal priest who recently arrived in Maine from away. Prior to moving to Vacationland, Sara was living in the Diocese of Rochester in upstate New York, where she worked in a partnership of parishes and helped to coordinate diocesan youth events. She has transferred that love of working with youth to her life here in Maine and is coordinating our upcoming diocesan youth events, including Finale Week at Camp Bishopswood this summer. Sara received a BA in Linguistics from Bryn Mawr College, and an MDiv at Virginia Theological Seminary.

Sara is married to Andrew, who is also an Episcopal priest. They live in Kennebunk with Maggie and Charlie, their two liturgically-infused children, and they worship together at St. David's, where Andrew serves as rector. In her spare time, Sara likes to cook, and she was both bewildered and overjoyed when her first attempt at gardening this past summer actually



yielded vegetables. Sara enjoys listening to people's stories and discovering where God is woven into the fabric of their lives.



Grant Us Strength and Courage and Power

Maybe you know I have the imperatives "Go in Peace, Go in Love" on my bumper sticker. I like the sentiment a lot, and it occasionally sparks conversations in parking lots. And I love the catchy tune my friend Sally wrote for them.

At the same time, the world is not often ready for peace and love. It's a tough place. We are discouraged by news coverage of the school shootings in Florida and elsewhere; the scenes of destruction and warfare around the world; the ways injustice and poverty eats away at our beloved communities. There aren't many people or situations that welcome something so profound and yet so simple as peace and love. And simply mouthing those words is completely inadequate.

We need something more than the simple willingness to go in peace and love. We need something we say every Sunday. In the morning services, we pray, "Grant us strength and courage to love and serve you." Or sometimes we pray, "Send us forth in the power of your Spirit."

Those are mighty nouns: strength, courage, power. But we have a hard time coming up with those qualities on our own. St. Augustine knew that. His commentary on Psalm 118 includes this: "My desire is insufficient, unless in what I have desired you yourself prevail and direct me."

I may desire all the peace and love in the world. But that desire sometimes seems feeble in the face of the violence and the hatred out there. It will take more than I can muster on my own much of the time. It's no coincidence that our prayers for strength, courage, and power come after the Eucharist. In both of those prayers, we are thanking God for the feast of Holy Communion, however each of us understands that. We have been nourished by the strength, courage and power of Jesus in some mystical yet real way. Our prayer is that we can hold on to them through the week and make a real difference. How will I (and you) demonstrate peace and love this month? How will I (and you) demonstrate strength, courage and power this month?

Saint Mary Schola: Masterpiece of Lent

Lent is a special time of year and the music associated with this season is very rich and moving. The St Mary Schola will present 'Masterworks of Lent' on Sunday, March 11, at 4 p.m. (repeat concerts on March 9 at the Cathedral of Immaculate Conception and March 13 at St. Luke's), a concert in which the great tenabrae service from Holy Week will feature some sublime motets by the Renaissance master, Gesualdo. Coupled with Gesualdo will be the greatly loved anthem from our Anglican tradition, by C. V. Stanford's 'Beati Quorum Via,' and a lovely 'Evening Song' by Josef Rheinberger, referring to Christ's plea to his disciples to 'stay with me - the evening approaches.'

From J. S. Bach's sacred music repertoire, a transcendental aria 'Blessed peace,' and another aria from his Lenten cantata 'Ich habe genug' (it is enough) will console our spirits. The concert will conclude with the oratorio by Giacomo Carissimi, Jona, which brings to life Jonah's dramatic story of sea storms, sea monsters and redemption, complete with period instruments.


