The elder said, "I am not aware of having ever told one of you to do something unless I had first made a resolution not to be angry if he did not do what I said. And in this way we lived together in peace all our days."

(From the Alphabetical Collection of the Apophthegmata Patrum)

Do you ever experience anger because people - whether those in your family, in your school, in your parish, or in your government – do not do what you want them to do? Of course you do – welcome to life as a human being! Whether or not you are in a position of leadership like abba Romanus, imagine how your experience would be different if you consistently made a similar resolution not to be angry when things do not go as you wish. Even more, imagine how the entire world would be different if everyone made such a resolution to cut off anger before it arose!

Anger is the rotten fruit of a desire for control. If there is someone calling you to be angry – no matter what the situation or issue or cause – then I guarantee you that they are trying to control your behavior for their own goals. Don't fall for it, my friends! Never allow yourself to be used as a pawn in someone else's game.

Now don't misunderstand. A rejection of anger is not the same as rejecting standards for behavior. You can be sure that abba Romanus had clear standards for how the brothers were to live together in their small Christian community. But the stark truth is that no one is able to control the behavior of another, apart from reliance on harmful forms of manipulation. The very best that one human can do is to struggle to control one's own behavior. That certainly is challenging enough! Abba Romanus learned this lesson after many years of leading others. We would be wise to heed his guidance. There are clear moral standards for behavior, and we need to keep each other accountable to these standards. But this must always be done apart from our ego need to control or punish others. Making a commitment beforehand to reject anger is one sure step toward a more peaceful and loving community.

I challenge you to try this out for yourself and see what happens. Make this resolution to reject anger before you read or watch the news. Make this resolution before a visit with challenging family members. Make this resolution before a performance evaluation review at work. Make this resolution before handing in an assignment at school. Whatever the situation you face, try moving forward in this way.

Our shared commitment to reject anger is one of the ways that we manifest ourselves as students of Jesus, as members of the Body of Christ. Let's practice this together and see how we can embody the love and grace of God in all the places that we live, study and work.

A Lamb and a Sinner

I attended a memorial service a few Saturdays ago. The deceased was a neighbor here at our retirement community, and his wife is a good friend. The mood was upbeat as many people remembered Pete's friendship and faith.

As the service was ending, I was struck again by a prayer from the burial service that asks our Savior to "acknowledge a sheep of your own fold, a lamb of your own flock, a sinner of your own redeeming" (BCP 499).

It was a powerful reminder for me of my Christian identity. I am one of the sheep of Christ's flock. When I get into trouble, I am one of the lambs that Christ leaves the ninety-and-nine to search for. And that means I am part of a larger community that Christ tends and cares for. God loves me with the kind of tenacity that will not let me go even when I stray. Christ's care is constant even when I am completely oblivious to it.

I love the metaphor of Christ as Good Shepherd.

But then the prayer calls me to go deeper: I am also "a sinner of your own redeeming." I am a sinner saved by Christ. Sometimes I don't feel like a cute little lamb gone astray. I am in misery over my own sin. I am anguished by the corporate sin I acquiesce to every day. I despair that I repeat the same failings over and over. Yet this prayer reminds me I am released from the grief and guilt. Christ's life, death and resurrection teach me and heal me. That's my current definition of "redemption".

You don't have to go to a funeral to know Christ's redeeming love. The end of the funeral prayer is very appropriate for those of us living out our lives here and now: "Receive (me) into the arms of your mercy, into the blessed rest of everlasting peace, and into the glorious company of the saints in light."

It seems to me we live simultaneously as lambs and sinners in the Kingdom of God that is present to us right now.


Wow! Only 4 months until the beginning of Advent and Saint Mary's Sparkles activities!


Summer Nursery Care
